Dear CHOI BUN CHAN,

Your application for a UK visa has been successful. This means that when you arrive in the UK you will have permission to be in the UK (known as Leave to Enter) as TIER 1 (ENTREPRENEUR) MIGRANT from 15 Jul 2016 to 15 Nov 2019.

What this means for you

Your passport/travel document contains a vignette (visa sticker), which you will use to travel to the UK. The vignette is valid for 30 days. If you do not arrive in the UK within this 30 day period you will need to apply for a vignette transfer, the fee for which can be found at www.gov.uk/visa-fees.

What you must do after arrival in the UK

Details of your permission will be on your Biometric Residence Permit (BRP). You must collect your BRP from the following collection point before your vignette expires or within 10 days of arriving in the UK, whichever is the later. If you fail to do so, you may be subject to a financial penalty or a reduction or cancellation of your leave.

If you leave the UK before you collect your BRP you may experience delays at the border upon your return, while further checks are made.

When you go to collect your BRP you must bring your passport/travel document containing the vignette. Please also bring this letter as it will help the staff to locate your BRP quickly.
